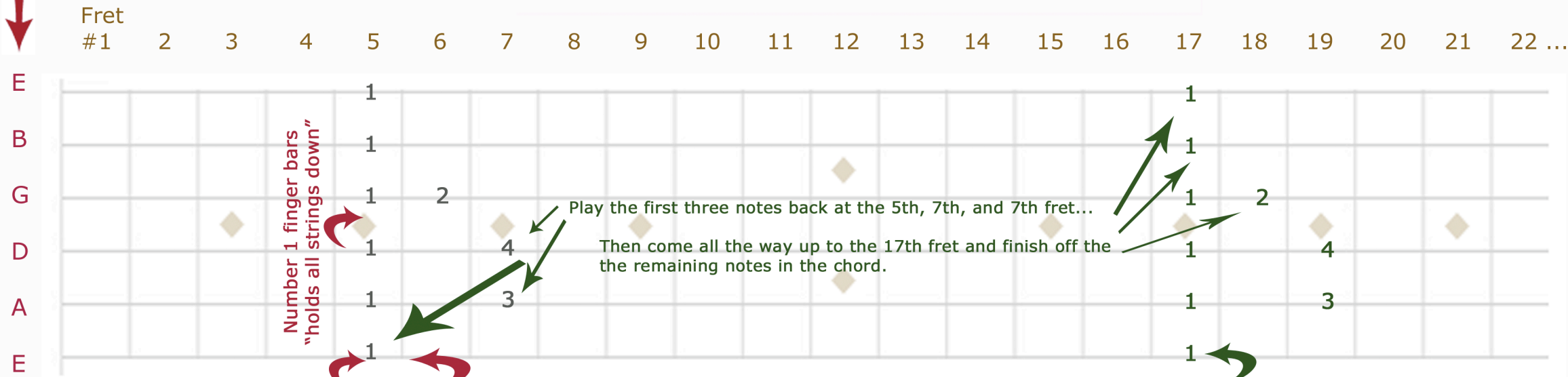


# Triple What You Know

(Part - A)

Confused? Watch the video one time!

Open String Note



Number 1 finger bars "holds all strings down"

Play the first three notes back at the 5th, 7th, and 7th fret...  
Then come all the way up to the 17th fret and finish off the the remaining notes in the chord.

Remember... Wherever your number one finger is in The A Power Chord Position (on the E string) tells you what key your playing in! This example is in the key of A.



Use the reference hand to the left to understand which fingers need to go on the neck of the guitar.

These notes are the same notes as back on the fifth fret position. It's up to you to decide what you want to do with them. just DON'T forget that they are there. Use them!

First, try the example shown on the guitar neck. Just follow along with the arrows (And Don't Forget You Have The Video lesson!!!).

Then try mixing it up some. Do the first two at the 17th and 19th fret and finish the chord back at the 5th fret. Just play with it!

Try it in the "A Power Chord Position" and the "D Power Chord Position"!



This lesson is going to focus on what you learned in the last lesson and show you how to get three times as much out of that same lesson.

Remember, this can apply to anything you already know about guitar but we are going to focus on two things:

- The A Power Chord Position (or Shape)
- The D Power Chord Position (or Shape)

Practice this on EVERY future lesson. Slide it to different keys!
