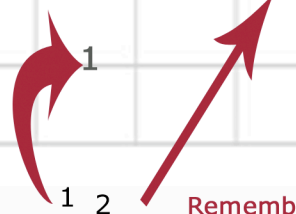
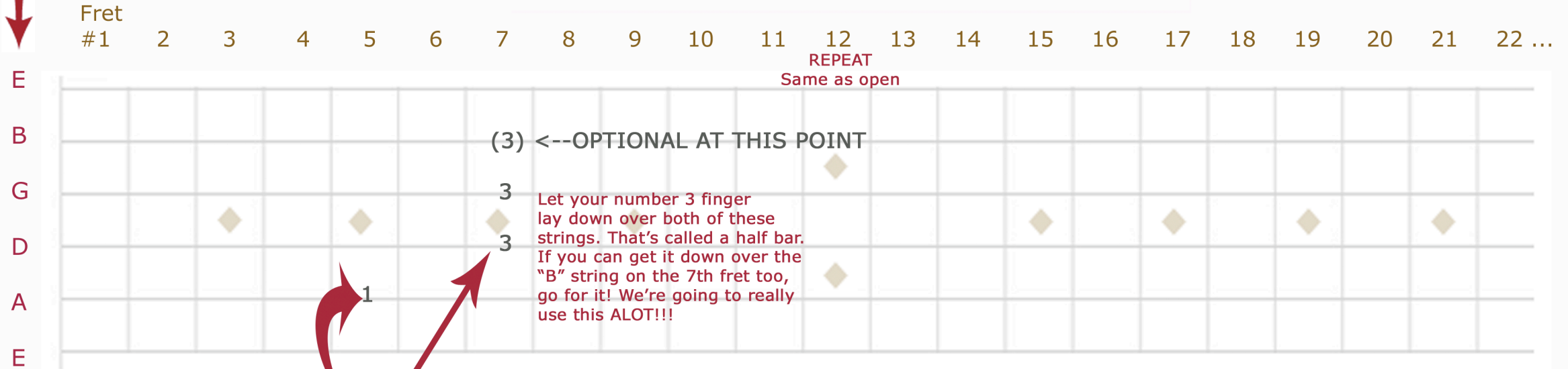


Understanding Power Chords (In 7 Minutes or Less) "The D Power Chord"

Confused? Watch the video one time!

Open String Note



Let your number 3 finger lay down over both of these strings. That's called a half bar. If you can get it down over the "B" string on the 7th fret too, go for it! We're going to really use this ALOT!!!

Remember... Wherever your number one finger is in The D Power Chord Position (on the A string) tells you what key your playing in! This example is in the key of D.

Use the reference hand to the left to understand which fingers need to go on the neck of the guitar.

NOTE FROM JERRY IN THE STUDIO...

In the last power chord, we focused on "The A Power Chord" position.

This lesson is going to focus on "The D Power Chord".

In this example, we're in the key of "D". Just refer to where your number one finger is on the "A" string, it tells us what key or "root" we're in. Now you can see without doubt, that first lesson with all the notes on the neck is truly the ultimate tool.

Remember, this can be slid up or down any number of frets. Just keep your fingers in the same position.

We will always call this position "The D Power Chord" position or shape.
