Open String Note

12th Fret Repeats Same as open

The DOTS in GREEN indicate the Pentatonic Minor scale in the key of A for this example.

This note with the blue triangle is your starting note in this lesson. NOTICE THAT IT IS IN THE PENTATONIC MINOR.

- All BLUE DOTS ARE THE "GOING COUNTRY" LESSON.
- Green dots are just there to show you how to use the original Pentatonic Minor as a reference for starting the "Going Country" lesson.
- Red dots are there just to show you "Front Stage" for this example and how easy it is to get to it using this lesson!

**DON'T FORGET TO APPLY "THE TRIPLE FACTOR" WHEN YOU FINISH THE RUN IN GOING COUNTRY!!! IT WILL BE SITTING RIGHT IN FRONT OF YOUR FINGERS WHEN YOU FINISH THE CLIMB UP THE NECK USING THIS LESSON. EASY STUFF! Practice this is key of F,G,A,B.**

**REMEMBER...** We don't want to sound like we're just going up and down a scale!

Don't get hung up on all the dots. Focus on the blue dots and the orange numbers that explain the order to play!

**Orange Numbers** tell you the order to play the string to get the lick we learned in the video.

- 1 A NUMBER BESIDE A DOT DOES NOT INDICATE THE FRET NUMBER LIKE TYPICAL GUITAR TAB!!! If you see the number 1 by a dot, that means to play that note first. A dot with the number 2 means play that note second, and so on and so on...

Run through the lick and then repeat it over again and again. Practice it forward and reversed.
